### Greetings!

We were given your email because you marked on your Smith application that you are "first gen." You might identify as first gen if you're the first in your family to be attending a four-year college. But you can also be first gen if your parents or grandparents attended *some college --* or if your older siblings or cousins graduated from college. It's really about whether the identity resonates with you. Here's a two-minute video of Smith faculty who were first in their families to attend a four-year college and what that meant for them.

We are inviting you to invite you to apply to a program called First Gen Out Loud. The program meets each week during first semester, with an option to participate during second semester. #### What's involved?

- Weekly meetings during first semester on Thursdays from 4:10 5:25 followed by peer-led dinner conversation from 5:30 6:30.
- Overnight retreat with the group from Oct 9 10. This is not a camping retreat; we stay in a center called <u>The Warren Conference Center</u>, which is about 90 minutes from Smith. The retreat will include games and good food. It will also engage you in writing and conversation with the goal of owning your own narrative and listening to others.
- Optional \*new\* program during second semester (more information to come).

#### What's good about First Gen Out Loud?

- Weekly peer-led dinners to engage you in reflection and conversation; the goal of these dinners is to gain comfort and have fun through storytelling and connection.
- Going away on a retreat over fall break!
- Connections with older students who went through the program.
- Meeting staff and faculty around the college who are particularly interested in connecting with first-gen students.
- Being reminded of how amazing Smith's first-gen community is, and of how much the community brings to Smith.

# What can you gain from the program?

- Increase sense of support by faculty and staff and peers
- Gain comfort writing and speaking in groups
- Develop comfort and skill with working in a group
- Gain comfort in public presentation
- Increase understanding of diverse perspectives
- Familiarize yourself with campus resources
